#### **Term One Inquiry**

Our mantra for 2022 is, 'It takes a village'. Throughout the year we want everyone to know that they are part of the SPS village and that everyone's contribution to the village matters.

Our inquiry for term one is 'SPS Our Turangawaewae' How do we keep our whakapapa of learning alive?'

Our students are looking at the artefacts, places and spaces in our school where their inquiry outcomes are located. The mission is to create a technological solution that enables anyone who comes across these artefacts to be able to access the full story behind each of these. Our teachers are working with Learning Architects who are an amazing tech company who specialises in all forms of digital technology processes. We will look forward to seeing what technological solutions our students develop over the term!



#### **Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS)**

The <u>Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS)</u> is a research study that provides both trend and snapshot information on the reading literacy of New Zealand's Year 5 students in both the international and national contexts. At the end of 2020 we were one of the schools selected at random to participate in this national / international study.

While the results are confidential to the study we can tell you that on average our students perform very close to the overall average of students in New Zealand. Further to this our students perform above the average of 'schools like ours' - this is mostly related to decile. This is an excellent result but even better than that is that our students are consistently well above the national average in terms of attitudes and self efficacy when it comes to reading. These are critical in ensuring enduring success for our students.

Absolutely amazing results - you should be so proud - we certainly are!

# **Property**

Our school frontage project is almost complete. The final stages of the geometric ground painting will be finished over the next few days. Our students love every aspect of it from the solar system to the Auckland volcanic field to the Tamaki Basin. The trees have not fared so well but we have a plan for them.

the time our students returned at the beginning of the year. No leaky buildings at SPS!
